

Kids' Fishing Calendar

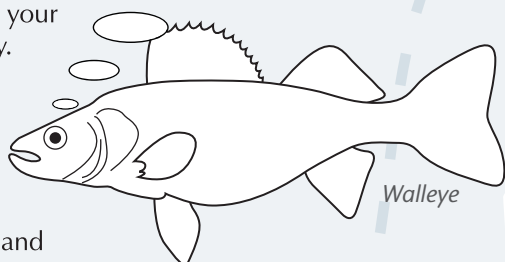
JANUARY & FEBRUARY

For ice fishing, fish the bays for bluegill and crappie. Also give Lake Poygan a try for the walleye. Partridge Lake is known for the northern pike.

MARCH

Near the end of the month the walleye run will start and last until April. The run will give you a good opportunity to catch your limit of walleye daily.

The best time to find me is late March and April. Try using a wolf river rig in the deep holes or current breaks. I really like minnows



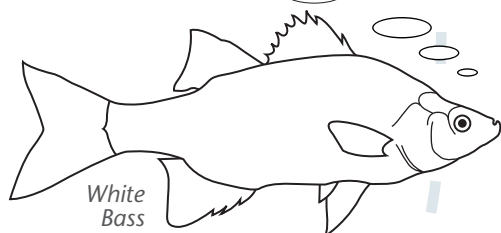
APRIL

The walleye run will be in full swing and lasts until the end of the month. At the same time, the white bass will start moving into the river.

MAY

This is your best month to catch big numbers of white bass. It's a great opportunity to bring the family and enjoy the fishing. If you like to fish largemouth bass, look in the bays for the largemouth. The northern pike, crappie and catfish will start to bite near the end of the month.

The best time to find me is May. Look for shallow sand bars and mud flats.

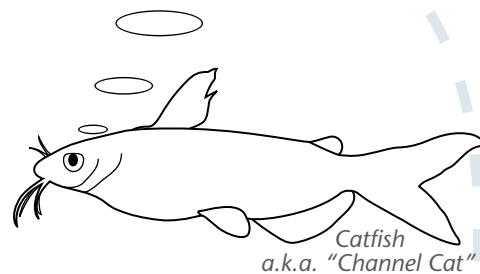

JUNE

This is a great month for the largemouth bass. With the warmer water, the catfish will be in the deep holes. The walleye fishing is excellent drifting and trolling Lake Poygan.

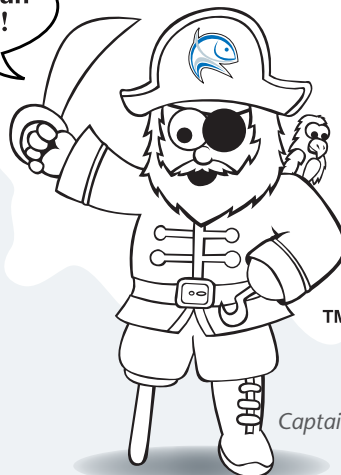
I can be caught as early as April and last all summer long. Fish the deep holes to find me. I like cut bait, stink bait, dead minnow and chicken livers.



JULY & AUGUST

Walleye can be caught drifting the river. Be sure to fish the wood in the river for crappie and bluegill.

SEPTEMBER

The fall white bass run starts in September. Walleye activity in the river will increase.

OCTOBER & NOVEMBER

The fall white bass run ends this month. The walleye bite increases with the colder water. The smallmouth bass will move back into the river and this will be a great opportunity to fish for them. Crappie can be found in the bays.

DECEMBER

Until the ice freezes over Partridge Lake is a prime location for catching northern pike. The river's colder water and bay areas allow for a good catch of pan fish.
